The Persuasion Strategies Experiment

Tested 5 "Juries"

- 1. No graphics
- 2. Flip chart graphics, created live
- 3. Static graphics, designed, but not animated
- 4. Animated graphics
- 5. Immersion: a mix of static and animated graphics used continuously so that imagery was shown throughout the presentation

The Persuasion Strategies Experiment

Benefits seen in the juries taught with graphics?



- Improved comprehension
- Better perception of the importance of central issues
- Greater perception of preparedness
